Position Summary

The West Side Nursery Coordinator supervises and coordinates staffing, volunteers, programming and curriculum for all nursery services at Redeemer west side. This person will work alongside the Children's Ministry Director to lead a nursery ministry and other CM events that are Gospel centered, age appropriate, and fits in with the overall vision of Redeemer Children's Ministry and Redeemer at large.

Job Description

- Coordinate all nursery programming including class schedules, curriculum, and classroom needs
- Oversee the hiring, management, and development of all nursery staff including interviewing potential staff, weekly staff meetings on Sundays, and conducting 1-2 staff evaluations per year
- Oversee the scheduling and management of all nursery volunteers
- Plan and lead 2 trainings for nursery staff and volunteers
- Coordinate childcare for Redeemer West Side events
- Oversee all nursery set up and check-in on Sundays
- Welcome and connect families with nursery age children to RPC West and regularly strategize how to better support families and help them get connected to Redeemer Children's Ministry and the church at large
- Plan 1 community building event each year for families with nursery age children and work with class parents of nursery to coordinate other events
- Coordinate baptism packets and welcome letters to all families who are having a child baptized or who are new to the nursery ministry
- Manage maternity sermon subscriptions
- Participate in West Side all-staff team meetings and West Side CM team meetings
- Attend leadership Summits and trainings
