In teaching, as well as parenting, I have learned two things. First, children experience every struggle I too encounter, though not always in degree or kind. They struggle with fear and greed; they crave approval and want desperately to be loved; they grow discouraged by their own sin; they mourn over friends who do not know Jesus, and they worry about the future. Sound familiar?

During his turn one young man looked up and said, "Sometimes I just want to feel like I matter, like I am important. This Psalm tells me that no matter how I feel, God says I am important to him and that makes things different."

There are moments when the Infinite draws very close and startles those of us who make a life out of talking about just such events. I knew that his insight was not from me. "You are right," I whispered, "It does matter."

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John3:16)

This verse, familiar to many, reminds us that sacrificial self-donation is at the heart of who God is. God gave his only Son. Christ gave his life. Why? So that we might inherit the eternal riches of life with God and his people. It is not surprising then that God, through his word, constantly challenges his people to respond to His grace with the same kind of sacrificial generosity. (2 Cor 8:7-11; Matthew 6:19-21).

As Redeemer's fiscal year winds to a close, we once again are asking our members and partners to consider their part in helping us make known in New York City what the Apostle Paul calls the 'glorious riches' of life with Christ. At the date of this printing, we need approximately \$1.8M in November and December to secure the year-end balance

necessary to proceed with the approved 2005 Vision Budget. Therefore, please prayerfully consider your investment in our mission. I have listed below several ways you can give to Redeemer Presbyterian Church.

- 3. You can donate stocks and mutual funds and other 'property' that often provide you with a double tax benefit (assuming the investment has appreciated and that you have held the stock for more than one year.) By donating appreciated securities you avoid the capital gains tax faced when selling the stock, and the church pays NO capital gains tax when it sells the donated security.
